From "Battlestar Galactica", there was Richard Hatch, Jack Stauffer, Herb Jefferson and (as a last-minute surprise) Richard Lynch. This was Mr. Lynch's very first convention appearance! He was very friendly and outgoing to all that spoke to him. Truly, one of the best guests at the convention.

On Friday, everyone got to see the Richard Hatch BSG: Second Coming trailer. As usual, it was given the usual standing ovation. Mr. Hatch also showed a one minute "making of" opening to "The Great War of Magellan". What was shown looked very interesting, even though there was no story to follow. Richard Hatch was joined on stage by Jack Stauffer and Richard Lynch. Mr. Lynch was a surprisingly funny speaker. He sang various showtunes mixed with a very funny roasting of Richard Hatch. In all, it lasted about an hour and it was great. He has a very good singing voice.
